PICKENS HIGH SCHOOL, 1875.

THE Exercises of the First Term of this School will commence January 18th and end June 4th; the Second Term, July 6th and end November 19th.

JUNIOR CLASS. 1st Term—Spelling, Webster's; Reading, Barrett's Series.

2d Term—Spelling and Reading continued; Primary Geography, Cornell's; Mental Arithmetic, Davies; Exercises in Writing.

INTERMEDIATE CLASS. 1st Term—Geography continued; Introductory English Grammar, Bullions; Reading continued; Elements of Written Arithmetic, Davies; Exercises in Writing.
