ON ELECTROCUTIONS.

DR. M'DONALD'S STATEMENT ON THOSE AT SING SING.

It Fully Confirms the Accounts Given by the United Press Scyle; - I monsibility Instantaneous and Death Speedy.

ALBANY, N. Y., Oct. 1 .- Dr. Carlos F. lacDonald, who superintended the electrocutions at Sing Sing, to-day made the following statement which in each particular verrifies the report of the United Press sent out on the day of the United Press sent out on the day of the electrocution. In this supplementary report of the details of the executions which took place at Sing Sing prison last July it is stated that in all these cases, one electrode was so applied as to cover the forehead and temples and the other a large one—the sulf of the the other-a large one-the calf of the right leg, except in the case of Joseph Wood, in which it was applied to the left leg, in consequence of the existence of an ulcer on the right one. The electrodes were thoroughly wet with a solution of salt and water before the current was turned on and were moistened at intervals when the current was interrupted, with the same solution thrown on them with a syringe. Slocum entered the execution room at 4:33 a.m. and passed at once to the chair. The restraining straps and electrodes were adjusted expeditiously and without resistance, and the electric circuit was completed for the first time at 4:35. The first contact lasted twenty-seven seconds at the end of which time it was broken but the pulse was still found to be beating strongly, and between one, and twelve minutes later a noisy respiration became established with considerable regularity. The current was immediately reapplied and continued for 2616 seconds. Respiration had then ceased entirely and permanently and the heart beats had also ceased. After Slocum's body had been removed consultation among the medical gentlemen present seemed to point to the unanimous feeling that it was quite possible that the long continuance of the current was not so significant a factor in producing rapid cessation of the heart beat, as the sudden impact of making and breaking the contact and for that

reason the next execution was conducted a little differently.

Harris Λ. Smiler entered the room at 5 CG a. m. The first contact was made at 508 a.m., and continued ten seconds; was then interrupted to allow of wetting sponges; was again made for ten seconds and again the sponges were wet, and a third contact was made for ten seconds. Three contacts of ten seconds each were thus made, at the end of which time there was no effort at respiration, but the pulse was beating so firmly and regularly that it was deemed expedient to again close the circuit for nineteen seconds, at the end of which time the heart had perman-

ently ceased beating.
It will be noticed that in the first case the pressure was applied for lifty-three second's in all. At the end of that time respiration and the heart beats had ceased permanently. ond case at the end of three contacts of ten seconds each the heart beat was still strong and at the end of the fourth application of nineteen seconds that had entirely ceased. It will appear from this that the duration of the current was quite as important an item as the making and breaking of a contact. It was therefore determined to make the contact in the next case a little longer, interruptions being necessary to

permit of moistening the sponges. Joseph Wood entered at 5.32 and the electric current was completed at 5.34. Three contacts of twenty seconds each were made at the end of which time respiration had ceased permanently; no pulse could be felt at the wrist and no heart beat was heard on examination.

Jugiro entered the room at 6 a.m. At 6.02 a. m. the current was closed for the first time, and three contacts of fifteen seconds each followed, with two inermissions of twenty seconds each. When the current was finally broken a very slight fluttering was relt at the In this case extreme heat was noticed in the region of the knee above the point where the lower electrode had been applied and a thermometer held against the skip for only lifteen seconds ran up 115 degrees, the highest point it registered. At 6.17 the chest was bared and cessation of the heart was confirmed,

From the experience had in these cases, the report says we are inclined to the belief that, while unconsciousness was instantaneous and continuous from the first moment of contact in each case, yet in order to insure that death supervene as rapidly as possible it was necessary to continue the voltage employed in these cases for from fifty to sixty seconds. In each case the temperature of the water near to and at he edges of the electrodes was raised nearly, if not quite, to the boiling point, so as to blister the skin more or less extensively. A Sensation at Vienna.

VIENNA, Oct. 2.-A profound sensation has been created by a dispatch from Reichenberg, Bohemia, which while announcing the safe arrival at that during last night an attempt was made to blow up the bridge at Rosenthal, a suburb of Reichenberg, by means of a bomb. Fortunately the plot was discovered and frustrated. It is supposed that the bomb was placed there in hope of killing the Emperor, whose train crossed the bridge in question. No arrests have been reported.

Smothered in Cotton Seed. RALEIGH, N. C., Oct. 3 .- Willioughby Sauls, of Wayne county, on going into his barn, wherein a large quantity of seed cotton was stored, discovered his live year-old daughter Mary with her head and a portion of her body in a hole in the cotton dead. She had imitated her brother, aged twelve, in digging the hole, and while the latter went to the house she deepened the cavity and stuck her head in it, but owing to the heavy presure of the cotton from all sides was unable to draw herself out and was smothered.
