Extra Court.

The extra term of the Court, on the civil side for Sumter, began its sittings on Monday last, Judge John T. GREEN presiding. Under his dispatch of business, the old musty docket is being cleared of its accumulated rubbish.

From this rubbish, too, under a recent decision of the Supreme Court of this State, declaring their legality, was resurrected a pile of negro bonds-or obligations given for the purchase of negro property. The announcement that judgment in these cases should be entered up, withbut argument or plea, came like a thunder clap. The public taind had generally cettled down under the impression that this class of old debts was dead; and especially was it believed that no action or decision contrary thereto would come from the existing judicial authorities in this State, representing, as they do, a party, whose soul and life has been derived from the obliteration and utter annihilation of every remaining vestige of slavery, either in its principles or practices, or

tangible form. We cannot but deprecate this addition to the terrible load of financial difficulty under which the people now groan. Eaten up with taxes, pressed and behind with obligations for agricultural and domestie supplies, dietress and ruin staring the country in the face, it was to have been hoped, that, at this time at least, we would have been spared this. We do not believe that the plaintiff parties to these debts wish to stir up and and increase the distress of the country at this time ; and, in our opinion, these debts cannot or should not be made valid until such time (if that time ever come) when the Government of the United States shall determine upon some compensation for the whole slave property of the country destroyed, or obliterated in the results

It is believed that this matter must go to the Supreme Court of the United States. If that Court sustain the decision of the Supreme Court of this State, then the principle that slave property should be paid for will have been admitted and declared; and house, of necessity, the Gor erament having destroyed that property, is the source from which payment for it should some Then, and not until then, may citizen rightness ly call apon sitisen for payment.
