The book gives briefly the extent. Discovery, the conquest, the settlements of our country; the origin of the Revolution, our Congress, and our laws; defines the purposes and powers of our Government, and the Houses of Congress; and, in short, comprehends that information of the government of the country so necessary for every American citizen.

Next was the afflictive announcement of the death of Mr. JULIUS C. McLAURIN, at his home near Stateburg - a young man of high and sterling character, and of much promise as a useful citizen. He had suffered long, and patiently, amidst the devoted attention of friends, and the tender ministrations that affection could bestow. But he was called from earth away to his heavenly reward, and his sorrowing surviving dear ones have a good hope.
