AN ORDINANCE.

To Provide for issuing Town Stock, under the 31st Section of the Act of the General Assembly, approved March the 9th, 1871, for the purpose of erecting a Market and Town Hall.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Intendant and Wardens of the Town of Sumter in Council assembled, and by the authority of the same, that there shall be issued Town Stock to the amount of ten thousand dollars, if so much be necessary, bearing an interest of eight per cent. per annum, payable on the first day of January of each year.
