Any person so liable, who shall fail to comply with the foregoing requirements will be subject to severe penalties.

Persons or firms liable to pay any of the Special Taxes named above must apply to L. CASS CARPENTER, Collector of Internal Revenue, at Columbia, and pay for and procure the Spe cial-Tax Stamps they need, prior to May 1, 1877

and without further notice.

Special-Tax Stamps will be transmitted by mail only on receipt from the person or firm or-dering the same of specific directions so to do, together with the necessary postage stamps or the amount required to pay the postage. The postage on one stamp is three cents and on two stamps six cents. If it is desired that they be transmitted by registered mail, ten cents addi-tional should accompany the application. GREEN B.
