Saving of Labor.

Labor at the South is at present very dear—apparently cheap enough when expressed in form of so many dollars per month, per hand—but really dear, when measured in terms of so much work, done in a given time.

MANURE FOR IRISH POTATOES.—For one acre, take 8 bushels of wood ash, 6 bushels of quick lime (oyster-shell lime should have the preference, if it can be obtained.)

The above supplies the essential ingredients for a large growth of potatoes, and something more provided the soil be not excessively meagre; and if there be an excess of these ingredients over the requirements for the present crop, it will be very sure to remain in the soil for the benefit of future crops.

CLOVER.—Clover differs entirely from the cereal crops in this: It sends its main roots perpendicularly downwards, when no obstacle stands in its way, to the depths which the fibrous roots of wheat and barley fail to reach;
