There will be Divine Service (D. V.) in the Presbyterian Church to-morrow at the usual hours, by the Pastor.

Praise to the Worthy.

We are requested by the Deputy Sheriff, to call the notice of the community to the praiseworthy conduct of James Mays, Wm. Myers, and Pator Bonnett, on Thursday of last week. These colored men used all their influence to counteract the pernicious effects of Randolph's attempt to excite the colored people to dangerous indiscretions. In so doing, they seconded the efforts of Messrs. Sturgeon and DeMars, which were exerted likewise in behalf of law and order.

Attention!

Copies of the following military orders are furnished us by General O. H. Hart, U. S. A. Military Commissioner and Agent of the Freedman's Bureau, with a request to publish them, for the information of citizens and all concerned.

[General Order No. 10.]

XII. The practice of carrying deadly weapons, except by officers and soldiers in the Military service of the United States, is prohibited. The concealment of such weapons on the person will be deemed an aggravation of the offence. A violation of this order will render the offender amenable to trial and punishment by Military Commission. Whenever wounding or killing shall result from the use of such weapons, proof that the party carried or concealed a deadly weapon, shall be deemed evidence of a felonious intent to take the life of the injured person.

[General Order No. 12.]

X. The sale of spirituous liquors, by any person or persons to soldiers, sailors or marines in the service of the United States, is hereby prohibited; and any person so offending, procuring for, or giving away to, any soldier, sailor, or marine, any spirituous liquors, will be brought to trial before a military tribunal, and shall be fined in a sum not exceeding one hundred nor less than fifty dollars, or imprisoned for a period not exceeding two months.

Washington News.

JUNE 12.—The Omnibus admission bill is through; some of its provisions were carried by a bare majority; but it was finally passed by both Houses by a full Radical vote against which a veto would be powerless, and the admission of these States including all but Virginia, Mississippi and Texas will occur in eleven days or sooner.

Reverdy Johnson was confirmed unanimously.

JUNE 13.—The two cent stamps on receipts has been stricken from the tax bill.

JUNE 15.—Senate the National Currency bill was resumed and discussed all day.

In the House—Under the regular call, among others was introduced a bill amending the Homestead law, also regulating habeas corpus, also dividing Texas, and providing for the admission of the fractions. Also authorizing and requiring the Secretary of War to deliver certain arms to the Southern States for their militia, immediately upon the discontinuance of military government therein.

JUNE 16.—It is rumored that General Martin McMahon, of New York, will be appointed Mexican Minister.

The United States Indian Agent, Leavenworth, in his report narrates numerous outrages on the part of the Comanches and the Kiowas. They seem to have a special predilection for raids into Texas. Leavenworth recommends they be punished promptly and severely.

JUNE 17.—In the Senate the Texas Convention resolution that reconstruction would fail under Buchanan's appointments was referred to the Judiciary Committee.

A memorial of W. S. Chipley, of Kentucky, that his son, residing at Columbus Ga, had been arrested by the military authorities, in violation of the constitution, and carried two hundred miles from his home, to Atlanta, where he is now confined and deprived of communication with his friends, and that he is falsely charged with being concerned in the murder of George W. Ashburn, who was killed in a negro house of ill fame, was referred to the Judiciary Committee.

A motion indefinitely postponing the Senate and House amendments to the Bankrupt law, was passed.

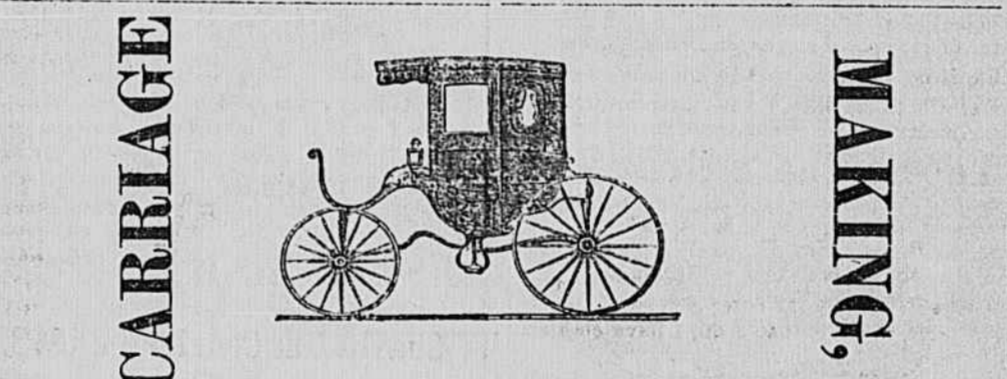
