Revival.—The Rev. Dr. I. D. Durham last week conducted a protracted Baptist meeting at Bull Swamp Church of much interest. Twenty-eight converts were taken into the Church, twenty-five for Bull Swamp membership and three for the Oranburg Church.

The Holy Ordinance of Baptism will take place in the Oranburg Baptist Church, tomorrow week.

The County Treasurer opened his books in our Town Thursday morning last for the collection of taxes. He has been pretty busy since. The majority of our citizens appear anxious to pay their taxes. Mr. Mount will close his books on the 1st day of September.

SALESDAY.—Quite a goodly crowd assembled in town yesterday last. A cheerful spirit seemed to prevail with all. Tee refreshing rains since salesday in July had, we expect, considerable to do with the exultation exhibited on most of the countenances we met. There were one or two, however, whose countenances betrayed much anxiety. Their homesteads were to be knocked down by the unmerciful hammer of the Sheriff.

One we noticed was sold for the payment of a slave bond.

Real estate brought good prices. We noticed the sales as follows:

- 225 acres brought \$400 cash.
- 275 acres brought \$500 cash.
- One lot in town, with frame house, unfinished, one half cash, balance in one year, brought \$1,350.
- The following were sold for one-third cash balance in one year:
 - 72 acres near the town \$1,000.
 - 4 acres near the town \$120.
 - 1 acre near the town, \$19.00.

Cotton.—The recent heavy rains, had they continued much longer, would have injured the cotton 'crop very materially. The blooms had commenced falling off considerably, but a few more days like the last two will set things all right again.

AN ORDINANCE TO DE-

TECT ILLICIT TRADING OF BEEF in the Corporate Limits of Oranburg Village, S. C.

SECTION 1. That from and after the 15th day of July, 1869, each and every individual offering BEEF within the Corporate Limits of Oranburg Village, either for Barter or Sale, shall bring with said Beef or Veal, the Heads in good condition, which Head or Heads shall be taken to the Office of the Clerk of Council, where shall be kept a Registration Book for the purpose of Recording therein, the Flesh Marks, Ear Marks and other Marks pertaining to identify.

SEC. 2. That said Marks and Identities pertaining to each Head, as Recorded by the Clerk, shall be prima facie evidence in question of dispute.

SEC. 3. That each and every instance of wilfully neglecting to report the Marks of each Beefs Head to the Clerk's Office or shall leave the Corporate Limits without Reporting the Marks, &c., as in Section 1st of this Ordinance is prescribed, shall be considered a Violation of this Ordinance, and the party so offending shall, for each and every offence, be fined in the sum of not less than One (1) Dollar nor more than Twenty (20) Dollars, at the discretion of the Council.

SEC. 4. The Informant of each and every offence shall be entitled to half the Fines collected: the other half to go to the benefit of the Corporation.

SEC. 5. That all Ordinances or part of Ordinances contrary or repugnant to this is hereby repealed.
