SHERIFF RIGGS AND THE HOME-STEAD LAW On Monday the 6th inst. Sheriff Riggs was indicted for failure to set off Homestead to I. W. Dash at his request. The Sheriff was arrested by W. R. Treadwell Esq., Coroner, and brought before Magistrate T. H. Cooke, for preliminary examination on yesterday.

The Sheriff appeared with his counsel Col. W. F. Hutson, who contended in in able argument, referring to numerous authorities, that the Prosecuting party was not entitled to have homestead set off in this particular case. W. J. De-Lands of Mrs. Claze, 138 acres, for Treville Esq., in behalf of the Prosecu tor, was heard in reply.

> Magistrate Cooke, rendered the following decision.

From the record in this case, the Court issuing the process has certified that the debt, for which the levy was made, was contracted for the purchase of the land levied on and improvements thereon. Therefore, there has been no violation of the Homestead law, not as suming to decide its constitutionality which expressly excepts this case.

Sheriff Riggs was then discharged by direction of the Court.

Our latest exchanges announce the death of Gen. John A. Rawlins, Secretary of War. He was a young man, whose only claim to distinctson, previous to the presidential election, was that he was Gen. Grant's Chief of staff during the war.
