Clerk of Council, where shall be kept a Registration Book for the purpose of Recording therein, the Flesh Marks, Ear Marks and other Marks pertaining to identify.

SEC. 2. That said Marks and Identities

pertaining to each Head, as Recorded by the Clerk, shall be prima facia evidence in ques-

Skc. 3. 
