THE CENSUS .- The census of the State, unade in 1869, is published. In 1860 the total population of the State of all colors and classes was 703.708. In 1869 it was 661,099 showing a decrease during the last nine years of 42,609 inhabitants.

The total population of Orangeburg County in 1860 was, 24,896 in 1869 it was 26,842, an increase of 1,309 colored inhabitants and of 637 whites.
