TAX NOTICE.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Office of County Treasurer for Orangeburg County, S. C., will be open for the Collection of State, County and School Taxes for the year 1871, on the Twentieth (20th) day of November A. D. 1871, and will continue open for the Collection of the said Taxes, until the Fifteenth (15th) day of January A. D. 1872.

The total rate per centum for State purposes is Seven (7) Mills on a dollar, and the per centum for General County Purposes is three (3) Mills on a dollar upon all the Real and Personal Property of each Tax Payer.

And at School Meetings held in the various School Districts of the County of Orangeburg in conformity to Section 61 of an Act entitled "An Act to Amend an Act entitled An Act to Establish and Maintain a System of Free Common Schools, &c." Approved March 2, 1871. The rates for School Purposes were fixed as follows, to wit:

In District number one (Vance), one-eighth (1/8) of one mill on a dollar; district No 4 (Amelia) two mills on a dollar; district No 5 (Providence), three per centum on the general tax; district No 9 (Middle), one-half mill on a dollar; district No 10 (Orange), one-half mill on a dollar; district No 13 (New Hope), one-half mill on a dollar; district No 15 (Edisto), one and three-fourths mills on a dollar; district No 16 (Union), two mills on a dollar; district No 19 (Liberty), one mill on a dollar; district No 20 (Goodland), one mill on a dollar, and district No 21 (Hebron), one mill on a dollar, upon all the Real and Personal Property in the respective School Districts.
