Notice is hereby given to the voters of Oranburg County, that in compliance with the above Proclamation and in pursuance of an act of the General Assembly approved March 1, 1870, entitled "An act, providing for the general election and the manner of conducting the same, amended by an act approved March 12, 1872, an election will be held in the County of Oranburg at the usual Polling precincts mentioned below, on the 5th day of November, for seven Presidential Electors.

Within three days thereafter the Chairman or one of the managers to be designated in writing by the Board, shall deliver to the Commissioners of Election the poll-list, the boxes containing the ballots, and written statement of the result of the Election in his precinct. The Polls shall be opened at 6 o'clock in the forenoon and closed at 6 o'clock in the afternoon, on the said day of Election, and shall be kept open during these hours without intermission or adjournment, and the Managers shall administer to each person offering to vote, an oath that they are qualified to vote at this Election according to the Constitution of this State, and that they have not voted during this Election.
