Eight Locks to the Boll.

THE ORIGIN AND CHARACTER OF THE PRODIGY COTTON.

The unparalleled productiveness of Cannon's prodigy cotton bids fair to inaugurate a new era in cotton planting, and, as there is evidently a disposition on the part of enterprising planters to give this cotton a trial, a comprehensive description of its origin and character will be of interest.

The prodigy cotton is a new and distinct species of short cotton, bearing eight locks to the boll—twice the number born by ordinary cotton. It is progressive, the tendency being to increase as several bolls have been gathered from the eight lock stalks which bore twelve locks.

Curing Hams.

The following is a good recipe for curing hams: Two and a half pounds salt petre, dried and finely powdered half bushel best Liverpool salt, three pounds brown sugar and a half gallon molasses.

The above is the exact amount required for 1,000 lbs. of pork. After being in salt three or four weeks, take out, wash clean the pieces, dry and hang it up for smoking. Three weeks is sufficient to smoke them thoroughly by fire made of hickory wood.

When smoked, take down and bag or pack away in dry chaff or cut straw. Examine them occasionally, and if found to be at all damp, renew the packing with dry material.

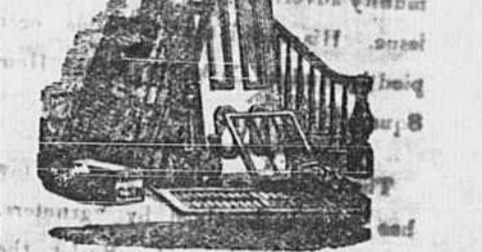
