Run derburg's field down to lands of Mr. Murfey. Along this road the water abounds to the depth of from three to four feet, and makes it difficult for travelling during the winter season. The public ought also to be concerned in this matter, for the simple reason we have been paying tax for the building of bridges and other public highways, and we have pot enjoyed any of it. Other public roads have received public aid but ours have not. Other town ships have been accommodated with public help and assistance, but ours has not. Now I think we ought to have a chance at Uncle Sam's pocket, and I think if we put our shoulders to the wheel we can effect a demonstration on the ditches herein described.
