Mr. Editor—I beg leave to call the attention of the citizens of Middle Township to the levy of last year, which was only the pitifully small sum of one mill on the dollar, and all because opposit parties were at the helm. But I hope when the next District meeting is called I'll be there to see for myself, to hear for myself and to talk for myself.

I beg leave also to call the attention of the inhabitants of the above township, especially those going up and down the Old Charleston Big Road, to and from Orangeburg village, S. C., that there ought to be a ditch cut four feet deep and three wide on each side of the Old Charleston Big Road, extending from the upper corner of Mr. H. Run derburg's field down to lands of Mr. Murfey. Along this road the water abounds to the depth of from three to four feet, and makes it difficult for travelling during the winter season. The public ought also to be concerned in this matter, for the simple reason we have been paying tax for the building of bridges and other public highways, and we have not enjoyed any of it. Other public roads have received public aid but ours have not. Other townships have been accommodated with public help and assistance, but ours has not. Now I think we ought to have a chance at Uncle Sam's pocket, and I think if we put our shoulders to the wheel we can effect a demonstration on the ditches herein described.

To all Whom it May Concern

Permitted to File 3, Chap. 13, Revised Statutes S. C. Section 58 requires: Sec. 58. If any person, company or corporation shall commence any business in any County of this State after the first day of September in any year, the capital or property employed in which shall not have been previously listed for taxation in said County, and shall not within thirty days thereafter make such report to the Auditor of said County as is required in the fifty-sixth Section of this Act, he or they shall forfeit and pay the sum of one hundred dollars, which shall be collected by civil action in the name of the County Commissioners, and paid into the County Treasury for the exclusive benefit of the County. And process in such case may issue out of the Court of Common Pleas of the County in which such business was commenced, directed to the proper officer, and be served in any County of this State.
