IMPORTANT TO ALL PERSONS HAVING CLAIMS AGAINST THE GOVERNMENT. By the tenth section of an Act approv-ed March 3, 1863, (12 Statutes at large, p. 765.) it is enacted that every claim against the United States, cognizable by the Court of Claims, shall be forever barred, unless the petition setting forth a full statement of the claim be filed in the Court, or transmitted to it within six years after the claim first accrues, pro-vided that claims accrued six years be fore the passage of the Act, shall not be barred if presented within three years after the passage of the Act.

Thus, all claims against the United States, cognizable by the Court of 'Claims, and of more than six years' standing, will be barred after the 3d of March, 1866.

The claims cognizable by said Court are: 1. All claims founded upon any law of Congress. 2. Upon any regulation of any Executive Department. 3. Upon any contract expressed or implied, except (1.) claims growing out of or dependent on any treaty stipulation, and (2) claims for property damaged, destroyed, or appropriated by the army or navy engaged in the suppression of the rebellion.

The above limitation, though con-tained in an Act respecting the Court of "Claims, has been by many supposed to extend to "all claims against the United States," whether prosecuted before the departments or offered to be set off by defendants in suits by the United States against them as debtors .- National Intelligencer:


