WASHINGTON, July 26 .- In the Senate today, when credentials of Patterson, from Tennessee, were read, Sumner moved they be referred to the Committee on the Judiciary with instructions to inquire whether he could take his seat. Sumner said he was a Judge under the Confederate Government, and therefore disqualified. After considerable discussion the motion was agreed to.
