Foreign News. Rome, November 23.—150 Bishops have arrived; many from America. Paris, November 23.—A meeting of the Italian Ministry, last night, resulted in a dissolution—all resigned. The Suez Canal is not regarded a complete success at London. The improvements must be made before the canal answers the full requirements of commerce.

New Orleans, November 27.—J. M. Cass has sued the Times for \$100,000 for libel, for publishing, in August last, an affidavit made before a justice of the peace by Edward H. McKay, charging Cass with embezzlement, and comments thereon in the local columns. Memphis, November 27.—Three field hands attacked a planter named Johnson, in Johnson County, Arkansas, with knives; Johnson killed two, and mortally wounded the third.—Johnson received more than twenty wounds but will recover. New York, November 27.—Charles Cahin, of Charleston, sent funds to New York, but reached this city in advance of his money; he drew a check for \$10,000, and that being dishonored, he was flung into prison.—Explanations were made before Judge Ingraham, yesterday, and Mr. Cahin was released.
