Relating to the inspection of property and conditions supposed to be in a condition liable to cause fire, and providing punishment for violating BE It Ordained by the Mayor and Aldermen of the Town Council of the Town of Yorkville, S. C., and by

the Town of Yorkville, S. C., and by authority of same:
Section 1. The Chief of the Fire Department or Chief of Police of the Town of Yorkville, S. C., shall have the right at all reasonable hours, for the purpose of examination, to enter into and upon all buildings and premises within the incorporate limits of said town where they have reason to believe such conditions exist as are said town where they have reason to believe such conditions exist as are likely to cause fire to originate by reason of the improper construction of buildings or the presence upon any premises of combustible or inflammable material or conditions dangerous to the safety of such buildings or premises and if they find such conditions to exist they shall order the same to be removed or remedied, and such order shall forthwith be compiled with by the owner or occupant of said building or premises within twenty-four

the owner or occupant of said building or premises within twenty-four hours after being received.

Sec. 2. Any owner or occupant of buildings or premises failing to comply with the orders of the officers above specified shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and punished by a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more than fifty dollars, or imprisonment of not less than ten nor more more than firly dollars, or high results of not less than ten nor more than thirty days, for each day's neglect to comply with the orders of said chief of police or chief of fire depart-
