TAX COLLECTIONS—1905. YORKVILLE, S. C., Sept. 15, 1905. IN accordance with the law, my books will be opened on the 15TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1905, for the collection of STATE, COUNTY AND SPECIAL TAXES for the fiscal year 1905, and will be kept open until the 31ST DAY OF DECEMBER, 1905, without penalty, after which day ONE PER CENT penalty will be added on all payments made in the month of FEBRUARY, and SEVEN PER CENT penalty on all payments made from the 15TH DAY OF MARCH, 1906, after that day all taxes not paid, will go into execution and be placed in the hands of the sheriff for collection, and all poll taxes will be turned over to magistrates for prosecution in accordance with law.
