

MERE MENTION.

Two men were killed, and three injured by an explosion of gas followed by fire in a garage in Chicago, Friday, Nov. 18. Two men were killed and three injured in an affray between a gang of cotton thieves and a posse attempting to arrest them at Rikers, Tenn., Friday. R. H. Snyder, former lieutenant governor of Louisiana, died at Rochester, N. Y., Friday. Two thousand bales of cotton were destroyed by fire in Columbus, Ga., Thursday. Albert J. Pikin, president of the American Locomotive Company, died at his home in Schenectady, N. Y., Sunday. The corner-stone of the McKinley monument, the gift of the American people, was laid in Canton, O., Thursday. Among those present were Vice President Fairbanks, postmaster General C. Cortisou, and David R. Francis of St. Louis. A German torpedo boat collided with a small steamer in Kiel Bay, near the national German naval station, during a snowstorm Friday night, drowning one officer and thirty-two sailors. Fifty-nine persons were killed and several others were injured by fire in a lodging house in Glasgow, Scotland, Sunday. One hundred and thirty persons lost their lives in the sinking of the British steamer, Hilda, in the English channel Saturday. Several of the bodies of the victims were washed ashore on the French coast near St. Malo highhouse. \$4,000 worth of cotton bales were destroyed by fire in the Overholt Distilling Company's plant at Broadford, Pa., Sunday.
