The attendance was very good throughout the meeting, considering that it came in a most busy time for the people Rev. Mr. Speake, who did all the preaching and is a most forceful and impressive speaker, was bothered with a right severe throat trouble the last few days of the meeting, but he held up wonderfully well, preaching twice every day. The results accomplished were very gratifying. There were thirty-seven additions to the church-thirty-five by profession and two by certificate. Another result is a general spiritual awakening in the church and community, which promises to have lasting effects. Mr. Speake was urged to remain over and continue the meeting through this week, but it was impossible for him to stay any longer than Sunday night, as he was sched-uled to assist Rev. J. N. Isom in a meeting in Greenville this week, beginning Monday night. 
