 Monterey, California, May 29: His body an unseen target for the rain of bullets of a firing squad at rifle practice, Capt. Hetherton, a private of company K, thirtieth infantry, stationed at the Presidio, was taking measurements of the range, was literally shot to pieces, and died after lingering in the reservation hospital for two days. The accident occurred last week, but the facts have just come to light. An investigation of the affair indicated the funeral and burial would all during the afternoon of the day he was shot. Hetherton crept upon embankment, and was shot while the bullets whizzed about him. His cries could not be heard. After

the first bullet had brought him down he made an effort to drag himself out of range, but no matter which way he turned, his escape was cut off by the flying missiles. Finally he sank the sand mound awaiting the shot that would end his torture. Bullets sped about him, ripping his clothes and tearing his flesh. When markers found his body his head had been shot nearly off. Hetherton was married.
