Attacks Tariff System.—An attack P URSUANT to a resolution of the Board of Directors of The Bank declared to the house that American manufacturers are abandoning the protective principle as unnecessary as they develop more scientific management of their own plants as now carried out in the more advanced Ameri-

can factories.

"The protective tariff has simply enabled American manufacturers to sell at such high prices that they have not studied their own conditions closely," said Mr. Redfield. "They have relied on government support, rather than upon close business management. Its effect has been to stimulate the development of plants until they are now so large that products must be sold abroad. In this condition the manufacturers no longer want to pay the can factories.
