County School Day. Rock Hill, Saturday, April 13th, morning session at Winthrop college, afternoon session on Graded school grounds.

Exhibit of work done in the schools during the past year will be found in the program—10:45 a. m.—The assembling of the various schools with their teachers in the college auditorium.

1:45—Leave for Graded school campus. 2:15 p. m.—Athletic contests. A school may send one contestant for each athletic event, unless otherwise stated. A pupil may enter any one of these events and take part also in two or even two of the mental contests.
