I sowed my alfaifa last fall on land that had been in course of preparation for about two years, and although it has come up to a kind of a stand, it is not what I would like to see. Except for the experience of others who have gone ahead of me, I would be discouraged; but as it is I am still hopeful. Mr. Alec Williford has a patch that is about two years old and it is coming along beautifully except in a few ing along beautifully except in a few spots, some of them not over five feet square. The patch generally shows a growth of from six to ten inches, and the poor spots show a sickly yellow growth, not over two inches high. Mr. Williford is feeling pretty good over it and he is still working. He remembers that it took three years to get the hers that it took three years to get the alfalfa well established on the Winthrop college farm, and he sees that when he gets the proper remedy applied to the poor spots here, inoculation, no doubt, he will have a patch to

I am still working along the theory that lack of inoculation is the trouble with my patch.
J. F. Reid, J. A. Black and severa others up around Rock Hill have five acres of alfalfa, and all are growing

J. W. Roddey is advocating the idea of sowing alfalfa seed along with the small grain during several years, as the best way of securing inoculation.

I got a good stand of vetch on a patch of land that way, and I have had the same experience with crimson clover.

I want to commend The Enquirer for the interest it has always taken in agriculture. It has made many suggestications

the interest it has always taken in agriculture. It has made many suggestions that help to make people think along better and more progressive lines, and in telling what some farmers are doing it helps others.

It is my opinion that if York county can make a success of alfalfa, and from what I have seen, I am inclined to think she can, it will be a great thing for her financially and otherwise.


