Sullivan of Illinois, and Tom Taggart of Indiana, as well as most of the Har- maid and Underwood delegates were behind Champ Clark and that practically every Wilson man in the convention was behind the other side.

Mr. Bryan had indicated no preference as between Clark and Wil- son, although his own state had in- dicated for Clark. He made no com- ment to make even on the result; but two things seemed to be made clear—that the Clark critics were against Bryan and although Bryan did not control a majority, the indications were that he had a balance of power.

The Clark people were in high feather as the outcome of the fight over the temporary chairmanship. They lacked neither in confidence nor in many votes as their preliminary polls had indicated; but still they believed that the result of the ballot promised their victory, and a majority of the most experienced poli- ticians seemed to share that view.

Most of the dispatches published in the papers of Wednesday morning fore-shadowed the nomination of Clark on one of the early ballots; but the Wilson people did not see their heart. They began to bank on the fact that it was a Progressive convention; that Clark had allied himself with the re- actionaries, and believing as they had good reason to believe that many of the delegates instructed for Clark were not sincere.
