

MERE-MENTION.

The republicans of Spain have become so active that the government is much perturbed over the situation and is mobilizing troops in the principal cities of the empire. The steamship James Gayley was sunk in Lake Superior Thursday after a collision with the Rensselaer. No lives were lost. The property loss was \$500,000, with no insurance. The health authorities in Philadelphia are making strenuous campaign against soft drink vendors who sell drinks sweetened with saccharine. Heavy fines are being imposed. Experts of the agricultural department estimate that poultrymen and dealers of the United States lose \$45,000,000 annually by improper handling of eggs. The Treasury department is now running a laundry for dirty currency and last week distributed \$500,000 of laundered bills that had been sent in to be exchanged for new currency. The battleships Nebraska and Connecticut were badly damaged by practice work off the New England coast last week. The Nebraska ran on an uncharted shoal and struck her bottom plates and the Connecticut broke a propeller shaft. Mrs. Florence Bernstein, 22 years old, is on trial in Chicago on the charge of murdering her husband. The prosecuting attorney is asking for the death penalty. The testimony in the bribery case against Clarence S. Darrow was completed at Los Angeles, Cal., Friday. A verdict will probably be rendered in the O'Callaghan case in jail in Brooklyn, N. Y., charged with attempting to kill his wife. He claims that he thought she was a burglar. Jacob Foy Guthrie, the "gentleman burglar" of Chicago, accused of stealing more than \$200,000 of property, has been indicted on eleven counts and is held in bonds of \$37,500. Three workmen were killed in a 250-foot shaft of the new acquisition of New York last Friday when a drill struck an unexploded dynamite charge. Mrs. F. H. Seelye of Exeter, Mass., last week gave birth to four babies, all girls. All the babies are living. Two hundred six workers of the Massachusetts are on a strike because of the refusal of their demand of a flat wage of \$1.65 per week. The Standard Oil company of Kansas is soon to increase its capital stock from \$1,000,000 to \$10,000,000. The increase is to come in the form of stock to be sold in the form of stock in St. Petersburg, Russia, and it is said that there may be many cases. Sixteen aldermen of Detroit, Mich., were arrested Friday on charges of grafting. The testimony has been worked up by the Burns agency and other agencies. Moorestown, N. J., has more than thirty cases of typhoid fever and the health authorities have traced it to an infected dairy. The 100th anniversary of the establishment of the Krupp iron works was celebrated at Essen, Germany, last week. About 1,500,000 acres of Indian lands in Wyoming, Utah and Montana are to be sold at public auction during September and October. The trial of fifty-four union leaders, for violation of the Federal laws relative to the interstate transportation of money, began at Indianapolis, Ind., October 1st. The trial will probably last a year. Sam Scheppe, wanted in New York, in connection with the Rosenthal murder, was arrested in Hot Springs, Ark., Saturday. George Wadley, president of the Southern States Cotton Corporation, has announced that a syndicate of German bankers is considering a plan of negotiating the American cotton crop to the extent of \$300,000,000. Burglars entered the vault of a Wall street, New York banking house morning by night. The vault was in the vault floor. They escaped with \$72,000. Four men, all Italians, were electrocuted at Sing Sing prison yesterday for the murder of a woman at Croton Lake in November last. A very severe earthquake did great damage throughout Turkey early Saturday morning. More than 1,000 deaths and 5,000 injured are reported. The property loss will total many millions. A candidate for the throne of Morocco, has abdicated his throne, and expressed the desire that his brother, Sultan Mohammed V, succeed him. Anton Kardos, an Austrian, now serving a three-months jail sentence at Washington, Pa., has been notified from Austria that his aunt died recently leaving him an estate of \$250,000. President Taft has vetoed twenty-five measures sent to him by congress since he took the presidential chair. One hundred policemen had a desperate battle with a mob of 10,000 in the suburbs of Pittsburgh, Pa., Saturday night. The trouble started when the police interfered with the speech of a Socialist orator. Many heads were cracked with police clubs. Secretary of State Knox will leave Washington on Thursday for Japan, where he goes as special ambassador of the United States to attend the funeral ceremonies of the late Emperor Mutsuhito. Mr. E. A. Tamm has been arrested by the police of Philadelphia, charged with murdering her husband by poison, after having been married only a few days. Marcel Rouches, 16 years old, has been sentenced by a Paris court to die on the guillotine, having murdered an American. An aviator flew from Joliet to Chicago, Ill., Sunday, 42 miles, in 27 minutes. Fifteen thousand rural cooperative banks in Germany have been consolidated. The combined capital of the banks will run high into the millions. Senator F. Pollock was grasping a wire on the top of a telephone pole at York, Pa., Sunday. A Cincinnati O. man took a police judge Saturday that he made a living by bleaching English sparrows and selling them for carnations. The Georgia legislature on Monday by a vote of 102 to 48, voted to repeal the tax on dogs in that state. The United States senate yesterday passed the Bourne-Bristow parcels post provision as a part of the postoffice appropriation bill. It provides for carrying the country into eight zones.
