I am watching the legislature of South Carolina and hoping and praying that it will pass some reasonable railroad bill. It ought to pass a bill requiring every railroad selling mileage tickets to sell one good for any number of persons to go anywhere on the system, just as they do all over the north, east of the arid prairie.

The requirement that holders of mileage books shall exchange mileage for tickets is a nuisance and an abomination and the requirement that a man shall buy a separate book for each member of his family is a robbery that ought not to be permitted.

I don't see why the railroads in South Carolina can't treat us like white people as they do in the north, instead of like colored. Only "colored" will do the subject justice. These nuisances ought to be abated, and the legislature can do it.

—London, February 17: Turkish soldiers early today attempted to assassinate and succeeded in badly wounding Enver Bey, the Young Turk leader. A news agency dispatch by wireless from Constantinople says that Enver was stabbed severely several times, but gives no further details. Enver is now in a despatching effort to pierce the flanks of the Bulgarian army on the shores of the Sea of Marmara with a former hope of Ottoman troops who were beaten back with terrible losses. He was one of the leaders in the recent revolt of the Young Turks and led to the renewal of the war between the Turks and the Balkan states. Several threats against his life had been made among the disaffected soldiers who were roused by the assassination of Nazim Pasha, their beloved commander-in-chief. Enver was a prominent military leader in the war in Tripoli and was called by European experts "the best soldier in the Turkish army."
