Thirty-three Indian chiefs, veterans of the battle of Gettysburg, were in New York last Saturday to take part in the laying of the cornerstone of a granite monument to be erected at Fort Mifflin, Pa. The monument is a memorial to the North American Indians. President Taft, the "big white chief" took part in the ceremonies. Lord Harewood, lord high chancellor of England, will be the principal speaker at the annual meeting of the American Bar association at New York, which will be held at the Waldorf Astor hotel on Monday, March 18. This will be the first time on record that a lord high chancellor of England has left the empire while holding office. The United States circuit court, has been elected to the United States senate by the West Virginia voters. The Pennsylvania railroad company will erect a \$25,000,000 terminal station in Chicago. The remains of seven children were buried Wednesday night at the Custer cemetery. The children had lost their lives in a fire which destroyed their home on the previous Wednesday night. A plane, piloted by a New York aviator, was made a prisoner. A surgeon at Montreal, Canada, on Saturday, performed the unusual operation of removing a bullet from the heart of a man who had been shot several days before. The patient is reported as improving.
