Smallpox in Chester. Chester Reporter: Acting upon representations made to him by citizens of Cornwell, County Supervisor Anderson called up Dr. J. A. Hayne, secretary of the state board of health, Saturday and urged that special deputies be appointed to look after the smallpox situation around Cornwell, there now being twenty or more cases of the disease in that vicinity, scattered over a number of plantations, and fears being entertained that the disease may spread further, unless vigorous steps are taken to curtail its progress. Dr. Hayne assented, and upon the recommendation of Dr. Geo. A. Hennies, acting as Dr. Hayne's representative, Sheriff Colvin appointed Messrs. W. A. McNeal and R. P. Wright deputies to isolate all persons sick with smallpox and to prevent all coming and going to and from households where the disease exists. Dr. Hennies has conducted a wholesale vaccination campaign in the Cornwell neighborhood, but notwithstanding this precaution the disease has spread over a considerable territory, and residents of that section are beginning to be alarmed.
