

Sec. 2. That on the sixth day of December, in

the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty, the Managers of Elections for the seve-ral Districts in the State shall, after giving public notice as in cases of elections for members of the Legislature, open the polls and hold elections in their respective Districts for Delegates to the said Convention, in all respects in the same manner and form, and at the same places, as elections are now conducted for members of the Legislature And all persons who are qualified and entitled, by the Constitution and laws of this State, to vote for members of the Legislature, shall be qualified and entitled to vote for said Delegates to said Convention; and in case of any vacancy occurring by death, resignation or removal from the State, or TERMS OF SUBSCRIPTION.
