The Rev. B. F. D. Perry, of the Episcopal Church at Camden, died on the 14th instant.

The Democratic State Committee of Connecticut has issued a call for a State Convention to meet at New Haven on Tuesday, February 3, to nominate a State ticket.

It is stated that Gen. B. F. Butler wrote the speech delivered by the colored member of the House of Representatives, Elliott, of South Carolina, in reply to Alexander H. Stephens, of Georgia, on the civil rights bill.

Jefferson Davis was called upon at Vicksburg, a few days ago, for a speech; but declined to make one, assigning as a reason that owing to his peculiar position, he ought to be silent; and besides, in speeches heretofore made, his remarks had been misconstrued to the injury of the Southern people.

A convention of the officers and soldiers of the late Confederate army is to be held in Nashville on the 22d of February, for the purpose of taking steps to secure a truthful history of the late war, by the selection of an historian who will bring to the work the necessary talents and acquirements.

Among the antiquities disposed of at a sale last week at Gordonsville, Va., were a bedstead that had belonged to Marie Antoinette, a chair once owned by General Washington, a piano once the property of John C. Calhoun, and many articles which formerly belonged to President Madison.

Edgar A. Poe published a capital sketch, entitled "How to Write a Blackwood Article," in the "Mosses" of South Carolina, has a patent way of composing messages, if it be true that he recently stole two-thirds of the message of the Governor of New Hampshire. The Detroit Free Press wonders he did not steal the whole of it, while the Louisville Courier-Journal explains that the other third was valueless, for it has been several years since a South Carolina official neglected to steal anything that was worth stealing.

The late Gov. Orr, in one of the few dispatches which he wrote during the short period which intervened between his arrival at St. Petersburg and his death, spoke thus of his reception by Prince Gortschakoff: "I had a short but agreeable interview with the Prince. He referred to the Catecazy affair, and expressed regret at its occurrence. He said that Catecazy was a fine writer, who had been with him four or five years in the foreign office, who, he thought, would be of great service in America, but that he turned out a meddlesome fellow, greatly lacking in judgment. He was, therefore, no longer in the service of the government."

AN ORDINANCE

TO RAISE SUPPLIES FOR THE TOWN OF ANDERSON, For the Year Ending 31st Dec., 1874.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Intendant and Wardens of the Town of Anderson, in Council assembled, and by the authority of the same, That a Tax for the sums and in the manner hereinafter named, shall be raised and paid into the public Treasury of the said Town, for the use and service thereof. That is to say—

ON REAL ESTATE. SECTION 1. Fifteen Cents on every hundred dollars worth of Real Estate, other than the Anderson High School and Greeley Institute, for the purpose of paying the expenses of the government of the Town, and Fifteen Cents on one hundred dollars worth Real Estate for the purpose of paying notes outstanding for rewards and Railroad expenses.

SALES OF GOODS, WARES, &c. SEC. 2. Twenty Cents on every hundred dollars of the amount of all sales of Goods, Wares and Merchandise, made by any person or persons, between the first day of January, 1873, and the first day of January, 1874.

INCOMES. SEC. 3. Twenty Cents for every hundred dollars of the amount of income arising from factories, the employment of faculties; from the practice of the professions of the law, medicine and dentistry; from the business of Daguerreotyping, ambrotyping and photographing in said Town; and all monies loaned at interest, and from dividends received on bank or other stocks.

CARRIAGES, OMNIBUSES, &c. SEC. 4. One Dollar on each and every four-wheeled pleasure carriage, drawn by two or more horses. Fifty Cents on every one-horse carriage, barouche, gig, sulky and buggy kept for pleasure and not for hire.

ROAD AND STREET TAX. SEC. 5. That all persons liable to work on the Streets, Ways and Roads be required to render five days labor on said streets, or have the right to commute the same by paying the sum of Two Dollars; and if any person liable to this duty shall fail or refuse to make payment by the time hereinafter specified, shall be held liable to the penalties as provided by law.

WATCHES. SEC. 6. One Dollar for each Gold Watch kept for private use. Fifty Cents for each Silver Watch, or Watch of any baser metal for private use.

ITINERANT TRADERS & AUCTIONEERS. SEC. 7. Five Dollars a day by any Itinerant Trader or Auctioneer offering for sale within the limits of the Town of Anderson any goods, wares or merchandise at auction or otherwise.

SEC. 8. And be it further Ordained, That the taxes on Real Estate shall be paid according to the valuation by the Town Assessor, and all other taxes according to the returns, made on oath, to the Clerk of the Council.

SEC. 9. And be it further Ordained, That all returns shall be made on or before the first day of February, 1874, and all taxes shall be paid on or before the first day of March next, except the tax on Omnibuses, Hacks, Carriages, Buggies, Wagons, Drays, &c., kept for hire, which shall be paid before such vehicles are allowed to run.

SEC. 10. And be it further Ordained, That the duties of the Clerk of Council shall be to receive the taxes on Omnibuses, Hacks, Carriages, Buggies, Wagons, Drays, &c., kept for hire, which shall be paid before such vehicles are allowed to run.
