The Great Bridge across the Mississippi, at St. Louis, has been completed amid general rejoicing. This bridge connects St. Louis with Sast St. Louis, in the State of Illinois. The river at that point is 1,500 feet wide. It is spanned by three arches of 500 feet length inside the piers on which they rest. In its construction chrome steel has been used. It has a tensile strain double that of ordinary steel. The bridge is arranged for railway and carriage tracks. It enters St. Louis near its business centre. There is no draw in it for the passage of boats, and as it is but about sixty feet above high water, only the smaller class of steamers can pass under it without lowering their chimneys. It is an enormous structure. It is claimed to be the most important, or at least the most notable railroad bridge in the world. Its cost, including approaches and tunnel, will not be less than \$10,000,000.
