The Republicans are jubilant over the result of the late elections. They have reduced the Democratic majority in Congress from forty-five to twelve.

The Augusta Cotton Mills strike has ended, and all of the mills are running again on full time. The mills and the operatives have both lost heavily by the strike, and it is not probable that the troubles will occur again.

The Democrats lost six Congressmen from Virginia, and in the vote in the State the Republicans had 15,000 majority. It is not often that a party is so short-sighted as the Virginia Democracy has been in retiring their great leader and state-man, the Hon. John S. Barbour.
