Cat Sucked Baby's Breath.

The death of the 8-months old taby of Gustave Brown of 1210 Gayord S.t, has proven to apprehensive Denver mothers the old time belief that a cat may take the life of a child by simply inhaling its breath. The strange case brought under the actual knowledge of Dr. F. E. When the baby was laid down and we were all working over it, the cat sat with its eyes fixed on the child, as if perfectly fascinated, and seemed under an almost hypnotic influence. It got up and walked around us and appeared to be crazy to get nearer the baby, until we finally became so annoyed at its strange behavior that we had to put it out."

Mrs. Jones declares that she has twice before known of instances in which a cat caused death in a way similar to the death of Mrs. Brown's ebild.

"My little cousin, a shild 4 years old," she says, "was killed in the same way a few years ago while asleep."
