COMMERCIAL.

NEW YORK.—Per schr D O Hulse—79 bales Up and Cotton, 6 bales Cotton Pickings, 25 packages Furniture, 10 bales Moss, 207 bundles and cases Paper, 16 bales Herring, 17 bales Ale, and casks Hardware, 23 kegs...

The Charleston Cotton Market. In consequence of the very light stock of Cotton on the market, the heavy decline at Liverpool announced by the Saxonia had no perceptible action on the market here.

MOBILE, April 12.—COTTON.—There was a general demand throughout the day, but the market was poorly supplied with desirable selections. Sales of 2500 bales were made, the market closing firm at fully one cent advance on yesterday's prices.

MEMPHIS, April 13.—COTTON.—The market was less favorable to the holder than on the day before, yet the New York quotations were one cent higher, 38c. This advance commanded little confidence, it being difficult to find a buyer; it appears, however, that it was founded on a change in the rate of exchange.

WILMINGTON, April 14.—P. M.—TURPENTINE.—Sales of 55 bbls at \$5.25 for new virgin, \$3 for yellow dip, and \$1.50 for hard per 280 lbs.

BALTIMORE, April 13.—COFFEE.—We report sales to-day of 160 bags Rio at 19 1/2 to 20 1/2 cents; also, 600 bags do, ex brig, on terms of transport. The bark May Queen, from Rio, is in the way with 3200 bags.

GRAIN.—Receipts of Wheat from Maryland and Pennsylvania are very trifling, giving an indication of an almost exhausted crop. The demand is good, and extreme prices are reported for prime and choice samples.

NEW YORK MARKET. MONEY MARKET. The New York market, of Saturday, 14th inst., says the money market is quiet and easy on call, at 5 to 6 per cent, and first-class acceptances are discounted at 6 to 6 1/2 per cent, and business notes at 5 1/2 to 7 1/2 per cent.

PRODUCE MARKET. NEW YORK, April 13.—COTTON.—The market was more active after the Government sales, but at lower prices. Sales 3500 bales at 37c to 38c for Middlings.
