MAIL POUGH BROKEN OPEN.—On yesterday morning, about nine o'clock, 'he through mail pough from Columbus to Savannah was returned, broken open, to the postoffice. It had been found in the ditch between the junction of the Muscogee Railroad with the Mobile and Girard Railroad, by a negro in the employ of the Muscogee Railroad, and by him handed over to the clerks of that corporation. The pough had been regularly receipted for at the postoffice by J. B. Mubroe, route agent, who has held that position for some time, and who, we believe, was a Federal soldier. He is no relation of the family of that name living here. The negro who drives the wagon says fe and Mr. M. found the sacks all right when put on the Muscogee cars Tuesday night. If so, the bag must have been thrown off at the point where it was ploaded up.

Beyond the fact that the pouch was regularly sent from the postoffice, as the receipt of the route agent shows, and that it was found broken open, nothing is known. The bag contained letters and papers from Columbus and points west for Savannah, the counties around that city and East Floric. It contained probably a hundred or more fetters, some thirty or forty of which were from Columbus. None from here were registered. There were several drafts, but their payment has been stopped. It is not known whether the pouch Contained money. The thieves bent the hasp a good deal trying to prize open the lock, and at last broke the leather strap. Ny papers or letters were left stre wa around. The only package it to in the pouch was a copy of the Weekly Sun, directed to Jacksonville, Florida.
