ROGRESS OF LIBERTY IN FRANCE

Latest advices from Paris bring the text of he new laws on the press and public meetings t seems strange, and all but incomprehensiole, that these two privileges,—the right to say n public, or print for the public, whatever any one may be inclined to,-which, from long practice we have become accustomed to consi er the very foundation stones of civil liberty should be all but unknown in a country claim ng to be a great democracy, where the sov reign was elected to his present lofty position by the universal suffrage of the people. Yes the nation has steadily advanced to "greater destinies" ever since the accession of the Emoint however, that we have had our misgivngs within the last few years, in regard to the great blessings of public meetings and a free ress. There is, we verily believe, room for serious doubt, whether we have not perhaps nad a little too much of this blessing, In other words, whether much harm has not resulted to he country, and to our free institutions by the stant tendency to keep the public in a state of gitation and excitement. The unrestrained ight of holding public meetings and discusing everything ad libitum, "interpellating" even he most established principles of the Constiution, has also, we believe, been productive of no little evil to the peace and well-being of so iety in this country.

Still, by nature and by instinct, we are Dem ocrats, and, notwithstanding the recognized langer of too much license to tongue and pen; we must still believe that liberal institution are not compatible with a fettered press or a nuzzled tribune; and, accordingly, we find the people of France restive and impatient of this bridgment of their liberties. The reason of he present agitation of these subjects in that country, is, as our readers doubtless remem er the recent decree of the Emperor, pro and other points. Laws have at length been framed in accordance with this decree, and it what the people desire, and what they se other nations around them enjoying, that the opposition speakers and papers keep up the ery. Under the new law ony Frenchman may start a political newspaper, and set up a print ng office or bookseller's shop without a special license: but in case he commits any of the nu nerous offences, to which these dangerous pro essions are exposed, he shall be punished after trial,-without jury, however,-by a judipial officer, and not, as heretofore. by an ad ninistrative officer. But when it is ascertained that these judicial officers are not unfre quently ignorant magistrates, taking their cue from the wishes of the Government, as we have recently seen in the case of M. Dr GIRARDIN), this will not be deemed such a great advantage over the ancien regime. The penalties are from 500 to 25,000 francs; susension of publication of a journal for from wo to six months; suppression; and disfranchisement for a period not to exceed five years. This is the new and more liberal legislation on

Public meetings may now be held, provided hat neither politics nor religion are discussed. The Greek digamma, the rings of Saturn, and perhaps also the interesting question whether r not gregarines are found in chignons,—these are legitimate topics. Not without conditions however. ! For it seems by the new and mo liberal law, it is still necessary that seven citizens, one day beforehand, submit a statement of the place, day, opening hour, and object of meeting to the Prefect, who will then grant the required permission. 1 A Government agent must be present, who may dissolve the assem-bly the moment when questions foreign to its declared object are introduced, or when it becomes tumultuous. He must see that it ad ourns before the police hour, i. e. when all the cafes, etc., must be closed. Nor must it be held in the open air. Moreover the Prefect may adjourn, and the Minister of the Interior pro hibit any meeting which seems to him likely to be troublesome. His Majesty, we thus per-ceive, kindly furnishes a chairman to every neeting to be held, who has the requisite authority to "preserve order." In order to a proper discharge of his duties, this "Governnent agent," who is to be slways present should be a consummate metaphysician. How nice some of the points he will have to decide For instance take a sitting of some learned society. How subtle the distinction between physics and metaphysics, between morals and eligion, between a discussion on the history and polity of ancient peoples and governments and the inference in the mind of the "agent," that when Rome is said France is mount In LIUS CESAN stands for Louis Napoleon, and the Bubicon, translated into good Parisian reads coup d'etat. How the poor agent's obtuse faculties must for ever be on the rack, sugpecting that the learned dons are making game of him. It is for his relief that Government has given him the benefit of his own doubts. Whenever he is unable to loosen the Gordisz knot, the great Macedonian's expedient is ever at his command. When he is unable to meet logic with logic, he can always "disperse them." The Emperor, moreover, shows a commenda-ble thoughtfulness in requiring all meetings to be held within doors, being desirous to preserve every one of his liege subjects (we beg pardon ellow-citizens, we mean) from catching the in-

fluenza. But political meetings may be held between he issuing of the imperial decree for election of deputies to the Legislature, and the five days, last preceding the election. But these again are placed under restrictions, other and n addition to those already enumerated. Violation of these several rules and restrictions are punishable with five, prison and disfran-While these two new laws show a

of things, far behind England and the United States, it is generally conceded they are in adrance of the old laws. But the age is essenially progressive, and it is fair to predict that hese laws must soon give place to more liberal enactments.

It may not be amiss here to reflect also that while our present condition is very far from en viable, and what little liberty we have is all upon inffrance, we are still better off than some o our fronsatlantic consins. And although such comparison cannot persuade us into a belief that we are enjoying the blessings of civil liberty, nurestricted, it, yet is not without its omfort. The development of popular instituions in France, moreover, is a very interest ing study for the cisatlantic observer. There


