

1866, all persons concerned are hereby notified to call at
this Office and take out the required license immediately,

II. It shall not be lawful for any owner, agent, master, or other person having charge of any vessel arriving or being in the port of Charleston, to permit or authorize any saliors, hotel or boarding house keeper, not licensed as hereinafter provided, or any agent, runner or employee of any sailor's or immigrant's hotel or boarding house, to board, or attempt to board, any vessel arriving in; or lying, or ceing in the harbor or port of Charleston, before such vessel shall have been made fast to the wharf, or anchored, with intent to invite, ask or solicit the boarding of any of the crew employed on such vessel.

III. It shall not be lawful for any sailor's or immigrant's hotel or boarding house keeper, or the employee of any sailor's or immigrant's hotel or boarding house keeper, having boarded any vessel made fast to any wharf in the port of Charleston, to neglect or refuse to leave said vessel, after having been ordered so to do by the master or person having charge of such vessel.

IV. It shall not be lawful for any person to keep, conduct or carry on, either as owner, proprietor, agent or otherwise, any sailor's or immigrant's boarding house, or sailor's or immigrant's boarding house, or sailor's or immigrant's hotel, in the city of Charleston, without having a license from the City Council thereof, V. It shall not be lawful for any person, not having the license in this Act provided, or not being the regular agent, runner or employee or a person having such license, to invite, ask or solicit in the city or harbor of Charleston, the boarding or lodging of any of the crew employed on any vossel, or of any immigrant arriving in the said city of Charleston.

VI. The City Council shall take the application of any person applying for a license to keep a sailors' or immigrant's hotel, in the city or tharbeston, and on the said city of the respectability and competency of such applicant, and of the suitableness of his accommodations, shall issue to him a license, which shall be good tor one year,

X. Every sailor's or immigrant's hotel or boarding-house keeper, and every agent, runner or employee of such hotel or boarding-house keeper, when boarding any vessel in the harbor of Charleston, or when inviting or soliciting the boarding or lodging of any seaman, sailor or person employed on any vessel, or of any immigrant, shall wear, conspicuously displayed, the shield or badge referred to in the foregoing section.

XI. It shall not be lawful for any person, except those named in the preceding section, to Lave, wear, exhibit or display any such shield or badge to any of the crew employed on any vessel, or to any immigrant so arriving in the city of Charleston, with the intent to invite, ask or solicit the boarding or lodging of such immigrant or of any of the crew employed on any vessel being in the harbor of Charleston.

XII. Whoever shall offend against any or either of the provisions contained in section 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 10 and 11, in this Act, shall be ceemed guilty of a musdemeanor, and shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year, and not less than thirty days, or by a fine not exceeding two hundred and fifty dollars, and not less than one hundred dollars, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

XIII. The word "vessel," as used in this Act, shall include vessels propelled by steam.





IN ACT POR THE BETTER PROTECTION OF BEAMEN AND TON.

I. Be it enucted, by the Senate and House of Representatives, now met and stitting in General Assembly, and by the suphority of the same, That it shall not be lawful for any person, except a pilot or public officer, to board or attempt to board a vessel arriving in the port or harbor of Charleston, before such vessel shall have been made fast to the wharf, without first obtaining leave from the master or person having charge of such vessel, or from her owner or agents.

II. It shall not be lawful for any owner, agent, master, or other person having charge of any vessel arriving or

same.

VII. The City Council may, upon satisfactory evidence of the disorderly enaracter of any sallors' or immigrants' hotel or boarding house, licensed as hereinbefore provided, or of the keeper or proprietor of any such house, or of any force, traud, deceit or misropresentation, in inviting or soliciting boarders or lodgers for such house, on the part of such keeper or proprietor, or any of his agents, runners, or employees, or of any attempt to persuade or entice any of the crew to desert from any vessel in the harbor of Charleston, by such keeper or proprietor, or any of his agents, runners or employees, revoke the license for keeping such house.

VIII. Every person receiving the license hereinbefore provided for shall pay to the City Gouncil foresaid the sum of twenty dollars.

IX. The said City Council shall furnish to each sallor's or immigrant's hotel or boarding house keeper, licensed by them as aforesaid, one or more badges or shields, en which shall be printed or engraved the name of such hotel or boarding house keeper, and the number and street of his ho el or boarding house; and which said badges or shields shall be surrendered to said City Council upon the revocation by them, or expiration of any license granted by them, as herein provided.

X. Every sailor's or immigrant's hotel or boarding-house keeper, and every agent, runner or employee of such hotel or boarding-house keeper, when boarding any wil. The City Council may, upon satisfactory evidence
