It is a matter of gratification that Charleston is fast shaking off the debris produced by the late war, and is now in a fair way of regaining her former commercial supremacy as the second great Southern city. Her merchants are alive to her wants, and are making the most stremous exertions to turn the tide of trade back into its old channels. The planters and merchants of eminence of Alabama and Georgia formerly patronized the Palmette City, but the war diverted that intercourse into other channels, and Charleston suffered mmeasurably by this loss. The associations which clieg round the old mart are strong, and the sympathy of the people of these States are enlisted in her recuperation. Let her merchants do but their duty in presenting the commercial advantages of Charleston, and trade, of its own accord, will naturally seek; the best market. This, coupled with old and hallowed memories, will Tehabilitate and give renewed presperity to the Mecca of the South, at whose sintic we have worshipped in the haleyon days of youth. That her presperity may be commensurate with her worth and sacred devotion to the lost cause, is the earnest wish of all who love her for her grand old memorics.
