RULES DETERMINING THE JURISDICTION OF PROBATE COURTS.—HEADQUARTERS SECOND MILITARY DISTRICT, CHARLESTON, S. C., Sept. 30, 1907.

PENDING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF RULES for the government of Military Tribunals in this district, the Chief Clerk of the Court has the honor to inform you that when the question involves the title of land, or in any civil case where the defendant is a non-resident of the district, the amount claimed, or the value of the property, or the amount of damages, exceeds twenty-five (\$25) dollars, the defendant is entitled to ten (10) days' notice; and if it exceeds one hundred (\$100) dollars, he shall be entitled to fifteen (15) days' notice.
