Our Washington Dispatches.

WASHINGTON, December 19.—In response to a letter proposing that the educational bill should be adopted after 1871, Senator Wilson, in anticipation of the meeting of the conference, has decided to apply only to those who attained their majority after 1871.

The Old and New School Presbyterians of Susquehanna and Luzerne Counties, Penn., have united on the basis adopted by the Presbyterian National Convention.

Congressional.

SENATE.
WASHINGTON, December 19.—The bill passed yesterday by the House, supplementary to the Reconstruction acts, was read twice and referred to the Judiciary Committee.

Several memorials regarding the rights of American citizens abroad were presented; speeches were made, urging immediate action.

The Deficiency bill from the House came up, and was debated at length, with calls for the yeas and nays on minor amendments, evidently with the view of staving off the cotton tax and anti-contractors bill until after the holidays.

Three amendments are pending on the cotton tax, and action to-morrow is probable. Doubts are expressed whether a quorum will be present to-morrow.

A letter was read from the Secretary of the Treasury, stating that the public exigencies would prevent contraction during this and the next month, and assuring the Senate that no further contraction would be made until Congress expressed its views. The Senate then adjourned.

In the House, after unimportant business, Mr. Joyce presented a resolution thanking General Hancock for his support of civil war. The Clerk was not permitted to conclude reading, when a storm of objections arose from the Republican side, and the regular order of business was insisted on.

The bill for the relief of deserters came up, when an amendment was offered depriving deserters to the enemy of its benefits. The discussion developed the fact that 250,000 deserters were on the rolls. The call for the previous question failed and the bill was recommitted.

Mr. Stokes presented a resolution guaranteeing the Government for losses incurred during the war. It was referred to the Committee on Claims.

A resolution was adopted directing further delay in selling the government interest in the Disal Swamp Canal.

The House went into the committee of the whole on the Deficiency and Reconstruction acts.

Mr. Boyer asked if it was now in order to move thanks to General Hancock for doing all in his power to abrogate military government and law.

Mr. Laurence moved an amendment that the conventions South do levy taxes to refund the reconstruction expenses, which the Chairman raised out of order.

The President sent a message to the House covering a report of E. J. Sharp sent to Europe last January to investigate whether the citizens of the United States implicated in Lincoln's assassination were in Europe. Sharp reports that there are no legal or reasonable proof to warrant the action of government against any persons now in Europe.

The Virginia Convention.

RICMOND, December 19.—In the convention the Judiciary Committee reported adversely to declaring void debts contracted since 1860 for the purchase of slaves, on the ground that the convention has no power to impair the obligations of debt, but cases must be decided by the civil courts. The report was tabled.

The following resolutions of inquiry were adopted: Of establishing houses of correction in cities of over 10,000 inhabitants; of establishing primary schools in districts where fifty children can attend, and grammar schools where two hundred can attend; of clothing the governor with power to remove political disabilities who pardons a criminal; of requiring all voting to be done by ballot.

A resolution requesting General Schofield to abolish distinctions on account of color in public conveyances, and a petition asking the same of the convention, was referred.

A resolution to require the legislature to impose a capitation tax of two dollars on all over sixteen years of age, for educational purposes, was tabled.

A resolution that the convention have no ground for apprehension that the liabilities of the State will not be met, was referred.

After some debate relative to drawing pay up to the recess, the convention adjourned.

A committee of three members of the convention, appointed by a Republican caucus, proceeded to Washington to-day, to see about reconstruction, including the matter of forming a new State Government.

Conservative Meeting in Alabama—The Constitution Denounced.

MONTEGOMERY, December 19.—A conservative meeting at the theatre to-night, was addressed by Henry C. Suple, James H. Canon, James Hodson and others, all strongly opposing the ratification of the new constitution. Letters were read from Daniel Pratt, Phoenix Cotton Manufacturer and capitalist of Atlanta County, and Samuel Reid, urging the defeat of the constitution and denouncing the convention.

The Georgia Convention.

ATLANTA, December 19.—At a caucus of the members of the Georgia Convention last night, it was resolved to support Chase for the Presidency. The convention to-day recommended the appointment of E. B. Bulloch, of Richmond, as Provisional Governor of Georgia, and passed several measures in regard to per diem and mileage of delegates.

Fire in Vicksburg, &c.

NEW ORLEANS, December 19.—Two more fires occurred in Vicksburg last night, one accidental and the low drifting, the other was the act of an incendiary. Loss \$18,000.

The bank of New Orleans has discontinued business on account of the depression in trade.

Terrible Railroad Accident.

BUFFALO, December 19.—The express train on the Lake Shore Railroad, near Anzota, ran off the track, the rear car went over sixty feet embankment, and forty-eight passengers were burnt to death. No Southern among them.

SOUTH CAROLINA CONFERENCE.

(FROM OUR OWN CORRESPONDENT.)
SIXTH DAY'S PROCEEDINGS.

MORGANTOWN, N. C., December 17.—Conference was opened with religious services by Rev. Alex. W. Walker, Bishop Doggett in the chair.
The Committee on the Bible Cause and on Sunday Schools made their report.

The Presiding Elders of Charleston District and preachers stationed in the city, were appointed a committee to superintend the publication of the minutes.

The report of the committee on the religious interests of the colored people was laid on the table, but the following resolutions, submitted by them, were adopted:

1. That we will continue to serve, as heretofore, the colored people who have remained under our care, or who may return to their former church relations.

2. That when we so desire, and the number will justify it, we will serve them separately, in places of their own.

3. That in accordance with the regulations of the last General Conference, we will issue colored colored preachers, by appointing preachers, white or colored, as that may be judged proper by the appointing power.

4. That we are ready to render them any service, even in their new church relations, which may be desired, and which may consist with other claims.

A communication was received from a committee of the African Church in Morganton, requesting this Conference to supply them with a pastor the ensuing year. They were invited, in view of the Bishop, on behalf of Conference, assured them that an effort would be made to comply with their request. One of the committee was recognized by Rev. J. W. Kelly as the man he had once met in California, digressing off his master as a faithful and extending his hand, made one of the most pathetic speeches of his life.

The Committee on Education submitted their report. The institutions of learning under the patronage of Conference are: Wofford College, Carolina Female College, Davenport Female College, Cokeburg School for boys and young men, Spartanburg Female College, and Mecklenburg Female College. All are reported under way, but suffering from the stringency of the times—able to do nothing. Columbia Female College is yet suspended.

Adjourned to meet at 3 1/2 o'clock.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

Rev. William Martin in the Chair—religious services by Rev. W. T. Capers.

There have been 1369 white and 616 colored infants baptised during the year. Eighteen hundred and ninety-two dollars and ten cents have been collected for missions. Only \$1369.40 have been collected to meet claims of \$540 for superannuated preachers and widows and orphans. There are 472 Sunday Schools, with 2686 officers and teachers, and 17,569 white, and 1814 colored scholars in the Conference.

A resolution of thanks to the lay delegation for their attendance and counsel at the present session was offered by J. W. Paetz, and passed by the minority with a rising vote.

On motion, it was Resolved, That our Bishops be requested to hold our annual sessions not later than Wednesday before the fourth Sabbath in November.

A Sunday School Board was organized under the Presidency of Rev. W. T. Capers.

Rev. F. M. Kennedy was elected to preach the next Conference sermon.

The Bishop presided in report of the Committee on Missions. Before receiving it the body joined in singing the hymn commencing "What though the conquering arm of death."

Only three members of the body have died during the year—Rev. W. A. Hemmingway, Rev. T. R. Walsh, and Rev. Wm. Crook. The reading of the report was attended with great solemnity. The memoirs will be published in the Minutes of the Conference.
