THE GREAT RAIN.—Charleston has seldom experienced a more thorough soaking than that of the past few days. The slight rain of Tuesday morning increased by night, and at ten o'clock it seemed as if the windows of Heaven were opened and the floods had descended upon the earth. In the northern portion of the city the streets bordering on the river were completely submerged, and pedestrians were compelled to wade and wade before they could reach their destination. The fall of water was greater than has before been recorded in the same length of time, and during twenty-four hours showed a total depth of four and a half inches.

THE COASTWISE TRADE OF CHARLESTON BY STEAM.—The heavy wind and rain of Tuesday night proved too much for the giant piston of the New Orleans Circus, and the canvas blew, flapped and strained in such a manner that the manager loosened the ropes and drew it down. Unfortunately the spot selected for the show is the lowest on the campus, and the water settled around the tent and rendered navigation somewhat difficult.
