POSTAL MONEY ORDERS FOR GERMANY .- BY an arrangement recently made by the Postoffice Department of the North German Union, money may be remitted by postal money order, from this coun try to any postoffice in the North German Union, Bavaria, Wurtemberg, Baden, Hesse, Luxemburg, the Netherlands, Deumark and Norway. The high est amounts that may be sent are for Germany and Luxemburg \$50, the Netherlands and Denmark \$87 25, and Norway \$23 35, all in gold. The cost of sending the money will be from 20 to 40 cents for Germany from 35 to 70 cents for the Netherlands from 35 to 65 cents for Denma-k, and 35 cents for Norway. Money to be remitted may be sent to Oelrichs & Co., No. 68 Broad-street, New York, to A. Shumacher & Co., No. 9 South Charles-street, Baltimore, or to Ed. F. Stockmeyer, New Or caus The sender must be careful to give his own full name and address, and that of the person who is to receive the money. 


