The report shows that three hundred and eighty five persons THEG were taken care of at the Alms House, at a cost of \$9450; six hundred at the City Hospital, at a cost of \$11,890; twenty-seven at the Old Folk's Home, at a cost of \$360; five hundred and twelve at the Shirar Dispensary, at a cost of \$1228; six hundred and fifty in Health District No. 4, at a cost of \$1560. Transportation was furnished to one hundred and ninety-two. at a cost of \$1157. 
