BURCHETT'S BAKERY BURNED.—A fire broke out last evening, at a quarter to seven o'clock, in the barroom of Mr. J. H. Burchett in the rear of his premises, on East Bay, between Tradd and Elliott streets. The alarm was promptly given from St. Michael's steeple, and the engines arrived quickly upon the scene of the fire. By their efforts the fire was confined to the bakehouse, where it originated, and was extinguished in about half an hour. The fire was caused by a crack in the oven which was highly heated, and over which the men were drying cracklings. They took fire suddenly and based up. The bakehouse and oven were entirely destroyed. There had been put up with new machinery, and fixtures when Mr. Burchett started the bakery business, a few months back, after the fire which occurred in this identical place in the spring. The loss is estimated at between eleven and twelve hundred dollars, not a dollar of which was insured. The work of the directors of the fire companies was rendered particularly dangerous by the insecure condition of the back wall of a building on the adjoining premises, a few yards in front of the bakehouse. The wall, which was originally but fourteen inches thick, has been worn away at the base, by the fire, to the extent of a great many feet. This makes it somewhat of a deadfall, and has before been noticed by the chief of the department.
