NEWS OF THE DAY.

Gold closed yesterday at 113 1/2. In New York, cotton closed active and easier; uplands 18c; sales 5045 bales. In Liverpool, cotton closed steady; uplands 9 1/2d, Orleans 9 1/2d; sales 15,000 bales.

We charge that the State officials, without authority of law, and in violation of a stringent provision of the State Constitution, have paid the bonds of the State, amounting to \$250,000, falling due on July 1, 1871.
